The vowel graphemes a, ab, y and ob represent either short or long vowel phonemes, while the graphemes o and 3 can be short, long or diphthong phonemes. The reader needs to decide their phonemic value on the basis of the context. The ю, я and яь are combinations of the semivowel morpheme /j/ and an ensuing short, long or diphthong vowel phoneme, while the grapheme e is preceded by the semivowel when it is word-initial (or syllable-initial). It represents the same phonemes as 3 in other situations.

The graphemes \ddot{e} , $\dot{\phi}$, $\dot{\mathbf{u}}$ and $\dot{\mathbf{b}}$ only appear in loan words from Russian; they do not represent phonemes that exist in Chechen. The phonemes /3/ and / $\dot{\mathbf{z}}$ / occur in dialect variants. They are represented as \mathbf{z} , \mathbf{z} in Cyrillic and as $d\mathbf{z}$, $d\mathbf{z}$ in the academic orthography.

The hard-sign ъ has two functions. Its main function is to represent the lengthened glottal stop /?:/. Its secondaryfunction is that of syllable divider and where there is confusion, the soft sign ь is used. The word /šeljel:a/ 'has become cold' is written шельелла, while /hal:akxil:a/ 'perished' is written as хІаллакьхилла, since the къ would be confused for a /q'/ phoneme.
